BUSH WINS; AMERICA LOSES

This is appalling because they would rather lose an election than sacrifice their principles.

I don't need to prove what I am saying; others have done it for me. Thousand of lawyers signed a White Paper stating that your disdain for the Constitution had not escaped their attention. If

you were a conservative you would never have surrounded yourself with "yes" men who thought they could steer around the Constitution.

You not being a true conservative has been costly for the Republican Party. Everyone recognizes that things have not gone well for a political party if at term's end the opposition chooses a candidate lacking in presidential qualities such as experience and integrity. It is as if the Democrats believe that they can win the White House no matter whom they choose. Just look at their nominee; he sits even to the left of FDR! Barack Obama is a flagrant Socialist, a lifelong friend of radicals, and a senator who more than any other has shown little or no regard for traditional mores.

Your administration has been so unnerving to Americans that it has galvanized the supporters of a candidate who is an insult to the nation. I am convinced that they are not out stumping for Obama because they really believe in him, but because they want to oppose what they think or *would like to think* are conservative politics.

In an attempt to win over some to the left, the Republican Party has nominated Senator John McCain of Arizona. By no stretch of the imagination can he be thought of as a conservative. This explains why he chose a stalking horse to be his running mate, Alaska Governor Sarah Palin. However, it is already apparent that she will not be able to influence him. I am convinced that he chose Palin because she is likely malleable. McCain will not change. Recently he reached out to those on the left in an attempt to find a solution to the financial crisis, even though the Freddie Mac and Fannie Mae debacle can be traced right back to them. The left has little or nothing to offer America yet McCain likes to cozy up to them. Why would you bring your bucket to an empty well?

Our Economic Crisis

Mr. Bush, I want you to know that I have changed the way I used to think about you and other so-called conservatives. At one time I believed that if a presidential candidate was morally upright and pro-family he would vote with those on the right when it came to fiscal policies and the protection of our liberties, but with time comes discernment.

I now know that you are an "interventionist" or what economists would call a Socialist. The recent sub-prime fiasco has confirmed this opinion. Like all Socialists of one shade or another you think that you can use Socialism in order to save Capitalism. That was the tact of John Maynard Keynes of England. The fact is however, that he really despised Capitalism, just like some of our leading senators and house representatives. I must tell you that by signing on to policies that call for government intervention you are, to use the words of respected economist Ludwig von Mises, "clutching at a straw." The policies you want us to adopt are clearly interventional which means that you are perpetuating the same actions that originally caused this economic catastrophe. Von Mises says, "All those evils which the progressives interpret as evidence of the failure of capitalism are the necessary outcome of allegedly social interference with the market."

Von Mises warned that interference in the market will lead down a thorny path. He speaks with the voice of authority. Interventionism "...is a method for the transformation of capitalism into socialism by successive steps."

But not all Socialist ideologues have promoted Socialism by the successive steps of interventionism. At first Karl Marx, the fountainhead of Socialism, called for interventionism but eventually, as you may know, he turned against using the slow approach. I really can't say that Marx would be pleased by your bailout. Capitalism, he supposed, must be allowed to evolve overtime so that by some peculiar law of nature it would one day die of natural causes, and then with a sudden thrust, Socialism would take its rightful place among the nations.

You are contributing to the *transformation* of Capitalism. What I mean is that you are on Marx's side. You are headed for the same destination as the Socialists even if you are driving in the slow lane. But who cares about what Marx might think? What counts is that you have roused the ire of a large number of thoughtful Americans!

I, for one, will fight against Socialism or what economist Frederick Hayek called "serfdom." Once the navy cruiser on which I served faced down a U.S.S.R. man-of-war in the Baltic Sea. Let me assure you, the 1,500 men who served on our ship did not stand behind their captain on that day only to have Soviet-style Socialism imposed on them at a later date, whether through interventionism or by some other means.

I am disgusted by the \$700 billion bailout bill and its pork passed by the legislature and signed by you. Shame on you and Congress, no, double and treble shame!

Your spirited appeals to Congress and subsequent bailout of Wall Street, or what most of us believe is just the tip of the iceberg, is causing anxiety because it cannot be paid for by any one generation. Nevertheless it appears this is the way you do things. Recently through the Freddie Mac/Fannie Mae bailout you managed to increase the deficit by almost fifty percent! Is that what a fiscal conservative would do? Is not "deficit spending" the hallmark of a good Socialist, a Lord Keynes? Wasn't it Keynes who instructed President Franklin Delano Roosevelt that deficit spending is the norm for a government, and all that red ink on ledgers are just numbers? Just look at us now; we are Capitalists without capital!

Your Culpa Mea

The housing and mortgage crisis happened on your watch. Of course you will plead innocent by reminding everyone that you had wanted to bring about reform in the way mortgage lenders do business. However you were too busy doing other things such as promoting the Iraq War which you financed by relying on Keynesian soft money.

The fact of the matter is that you are not altogether innocent. Recently I heard a recording of a speech which you gave in 2002. It gave me the impression that you were not above applying pressure on the mortgage industry so that those whom you called "Anglos" and those whom you referred to as "others" could experience the American dream of owning their homes. You

wanted millions of new houses by 2010. Openly you were advocating laissez-faire economics, but it is possible because of your meddling that in the long-run you are no better than Presidents Jimmy Carter or Bill Clinton.
