Lost Liberties and a Lousy Independence Day

We have just celebrated another Fourth. Some did it with a fifth, which is the way they celebrate just about everything - even the birth of Christ Jesus. I caution against practices of that kind because this is a time in history when we must remain sober. We have a **Progressive** sitting in the oval office who by all accounts is drunk with power. What should be understood is that he is the one who acts, not the Congress, or the Senate, or the people, but Obama. I am not afraid of Al Qaida; I am afraid of Congress.

Why are we cheering at passing parades and shooting off fireworks when so many of our freedoms are being systematically dismantled? Under the cover of economic necessity our freedoms are slowly disappearing. Old Tom Paine is right again – "These are the times that try men's souls."

Just look at what has happened over the past few years.

- Gone is your right, on religious or other grounds, to take care of heath matters. Now you must buy insurance even if you don't need or want it. Friedrich **Hayek said**, "**Liberty is the absence of coercion**." You are less free than you were a year ago because you can now be coerced into buying health insurance. What is next?
- Gone is the right to tan in a salon without paying a ten percent tax. Is this possible?

- Gone is your right to resist the local government when it lays claim to your property through eminent domain so that it can increase revenues.
- New York state now wants to control what happens to your body after you die. This is the greatest act of presumption ever assumed by any modern day government. Unless you sign a paper saying that you do not want to be an organ donor, the state could rob your grave. That heart or liver that served you so well could now belong to the government. We must not forget that New York was the first state to authorize elective abortion. What begins in New York has a way of traveling throughout the country. Be ye warned America!

Calvin Coolidge [1872-1933]

President Calvin Coolidge, sorely neglected by historians, was a real Conservative.

In his 1915 Fourth of July speech Coolidge took on the Progressives. He was fully aware of the fact that human nature is now what it has always been. The entire speech should be read; it is a masterpiece. Coolidge pointed out that power-grabbing is older than what the Founders of America envisioned and that to suggest that we go beyond the Declaration of Independence is to return to what America rid itself of in the War for Independence.

About the Declaration there is a *finality t*hat is exceedingly restful. It is often asserted that the world has made a great deal of progress since 1776, that we have had new thoughts and new experiences which have given us a great advance over the people of that day, and that we may therefore very well discard their conclusions for something more modern. But that reasoning cannot be applied to this great charter. If all men are created equal, that is final. If they are endowed with inalienable rights, that is final. If governments derive their just powers from the consent of the governed, that is final. No advance, no progress can be made beyond these propositions. If anyone wishes to deny their truth or their soundness, the only direction in which he can proceed historically is not forward, but backward toward the time when there was no equality, no rights of the individual, no rule of the people. Those wishing to proceed in that direction cannot lay claim to progress. They are reactionary. *Their ideas are not more modern, but more ancient, than those of the Revolutionary fathers.* [emphasis added]
