The Blame Game Idiots and the 2012 Election

I am one of those Americans.

I know that Obama, if we let him, would bring such changes to our form of government that it would no longer be recognizable. I know that presidents lie, cheat on their wives, start unnecessary wars, etc., but that is not the worst thing I could say about any sitting president. I know that Obama would like to radicalize our republic.
